DETROIT LIONS VS. CINCINNATI BENGALS

The Detroit Lions kick off the 2011 preseason Friday, August 12 at Ford Field when they face the Cincinnati Bengals at 7:30 p.m. Friday's game will mark the 36th time the two have met in the preseason, with the last meeting coming in 2008, which Detroit won 27-10 at Cincinnati. This week's game will be televised in Metro Detroit on the team's new local television partner WXYZ-TV ABC 7. **Matt Shepard** will handle play-by-play and former Lions TE **Rob Rubick** will add color commentary while WXYZ-TV sports-caster **Tom Leyden** reports from the sideline.

OFFSEASON ATTENTION

After closing out the 2010 season with a four-game winning streak, the Detroit Lions have received a significant amount of national attention as being a young, up-and-coming team.

There's no doubt that media and fans alike have developed high expectations for the 2011 season, but for Head Coach Jim Schwartz, high expectations have been a part of this team from the beginning of last year.

Head Coach Jim Schwartz: "We talked about that from the very time that we got back and even talked about that with our team last year with our final streak of four. It sounded foolish at the time, but (we were) saying that we were going to pretend we needed to make a four-game run to win the division, make the playoffs, all those kinds of things. We said we'd be doing it in the future and (that we didn't) need it to be the first time we've ever gone through that."

"This isn't a new thing having expectations. We've had expectations all along, it started last year. We talked about it in training camp this year; we talked about it with the team. It doesn't take away from going out and practicing hard. Expectations are good and having the confidence and things like that to do it is good. But also knowing that the only thing we can do today is have a good day at practice. We can't accomplish anything else today."

Players, too, have noticed the increase in recognition, but the outside buzz hasn't changed their approach.

WR Nate Burleson: "We keep the same mindset that we did last year when people said that we were going to be the 'same old Lions.' Regardless of whether people are saying how great we are or how bad we are, we're still going to approach it the same way because at the end of the day, it's going to be the people within these doors that are going to have to play on Sun.. You can pat us on the back or you can kick us in the butt, we're still going to go out there and play on Sun.'s."

Lions TE **Tony Scheffler** doesn't think the outside optimism will have a negative affect on the team in terms of producing, but it's something he says they need to keep in perspective.

some recognition, we've got to keep an even keel and focus on the team; getting better and doing what we're doing."

NEW ADDITIONS THROUGH FREE AGENCY

Last year, Schwartz and the Lions' front office made significant personnel changes, including the acquisitions of **DE Kyle Vanden Bosch**, **DT Corey Williams** and **WR Nate Burleson**.

This year, the Lions didn't need to make as big of a "splash" during free agency.

Lions Vice Chairman Bill Ford Jr.: "I think it's a function of our team needs. We are a much more complete team this year than we were last year."

"The team has really come together and there aren't a lot of holes and there are a few that Martin (Mayhew) is working on, but overall I think we're a very solid team. One of the things, talking to Matthew (Stafford), when they practiced at Country Day (H.S.), he said we were able to run 60 plays and run them well because there was so much continuity in that group."

One position in particular that the Lions focused on improving was linebacker, and they picked up two solid veterans in **Justin Durant** and **Stephen Tulloch**.

Tulloch, who has familiarity with Schwartz from Tennessee, said it was a "no brainer" for him to come to Detroit and be a part of the building process.

Tulloch: "I decided to come here and play behind a great defensive line with Suh and Vanden Bosch. He told me they're only a couple players away from getting to where they want to be and when he told me that I just told him I wanted to come here and contribute and do whatever I can do to get this team to the next level."

Durant shared the same sentiment on his decision to come to Detroit.

Durant: "I just felt like the scheme was good, we had a nice, young team – a lot of good talent. Getting the opportunity to play behind this defensive line would be great for me. I think it would be great for both sides. They can help me out, I can help them out. It's all about teamwork and I felt like it would be a good situation."

Detroit also addressed the secondary in free agency, picking up **CB Eric Wright**, who spent the previous four seasons in Cleveland.

Wright is looking forward to getting a fresh start in Detroit, adding pro experience to the Lions' backfield.

Wright: "I think this organization is one that's been making a lot of moves to bring some wins to the city of Detroit. For me, personally, I just have to be a piece to the puzzle.

"It's a brand new start. (I'm) feeling good, feeling comfortable. Felt good and comfortable last year at times, too. I'm just glad to be here, start fresh and play like I know how."

While Schwartz has put players in place that he feels will make a significant impact on the field, the process doesn't end there. Finding the best players available is something that's always on the radar.

And building the roster is a continuous process.

Schwartz: "There's always things that come up you need to

LIONS KICKOFF LUNCHEON

The 15th annual Detroit Lions Kickoff Luncheon presented by the Wisne Family and hosted by the Detroit Economic Club will be held on Wednesday, Aug. 31, at Ford Field. Lunch and team introductions will begin at Noon in the Ford Field atrium followed by the program that will feature Lions' head coach Jim Schwartz and the 2011 Detroit Lions. A portion of the proceeds from the luncheon will go to Detroit Lions Charities, the Lions' non-profit foundation that has donated nearly \$6 million to charities in Michigan. The primary recipient of Charities' proceeds from the luncheon will be Think Detroit PAL youth football, which includes approximately 3,200 Detroit children playing in the nation's largest after-school tackle football league. react to, and things you need to be proactive with and other things that are short-term and long-range and things like that. Obviously, coming from where we started and where the team was—it needed to be done. We've made good progress, but we still have a long way to go."

STAFFORD BACK AT THE HELM

One of the key players of interest during the offseason was **QB Matthew Stafford**.

While players had to organize their own workout programs, all eyes were on the third-year quarterback as he bounced back from shoulder surgery.

C Dominic Raiola: "He's healthy. He's throwing the ball well. We want to keep him on the field and see what happens because we feel good with him back there. We feel like we can win and be successful."

One of Stafford's favorite targets, **WR Calvin Johnson**, has been impressed with the way Stafford is throwing the ball so far.

Johnson: "It was during our first practice and Stafford was already testing me. He was putting the ball all the way out there - he thought that was funny. I worked out with him a little bit this offseason - he looked good and he still looks good right now."

Stafford, who says he feels 100-percent, is excited for the Lions' first preseason game against Cincinnati, to get back on the field and face-off against an opponent.

Stafford: "Yeah, it's going to be fun. Definitely to have the crowd out there and playing against a different team. Being able to compete is going to be a lot of fun.

"I think we're doing a good job of working hard in camp, putting our heads down and grinding a little bit. So that's a positive, but the first preseason game is always a learning experience that helps you figure out what you need to do in the coming weeks to get ready for the opener."

PRESEASON INJURIES

In football, injuries are inevitable at some point in a player's career.

For the Lions, the top three of their five 2011 draft picks have suffered injuries during training camp.

DT Nick Fairley went out with a foot injury that required surgery, **WR Titus Young** has had tightness and therefore limited in practice this week, and **RB Mikel Leshoure** tore his Achilles tendon, prematurely ending his rookie season.

Schwartz: "He was doing very well. Not only running the football, but in the passing game and as a protector, special teams. (He) really made a good impression. That was the reason we traded up and were very excited about getting him. Like I said, we still feel very strongly about him, he will be back - it just won't be this season."

Second-year **RB Jahvid Best**, who dealt with turf toe injuries last season, was still in the process of getting comfortable working with Leshoure on the field, but he already saw glimpses of what the rookie is capable of.

Best: "He's a great player. If it was any great player it's going to hurt us. He's got a bright future; this is just a minor setback. Just press the pause button for a little bit and as soon as you press play, he'll be right back where he started."

LIONS-BENGALS SERIES

The Lions have only faced the Bengals 10 times during the regular season, with Cincinnati holding a 7-3 series record. The Lions and Bengals met every year in preseason from 1970-2001 and the rivalry was renewed in 2003. The two teams have played a total of 35 preseason games, with the Bengals holding a slight 18-17 series edge.

FAMILIAR FOES

- Lions Head Coach Jim Schwartz and Bengals Head Coach Marvin Lewis spent three seasons together as defensive assistants with the Baltimore Ravens (1996-98).

DRAFTING HOUSTON

- Bengals Defensive Coordinator Mike Zimmer was Defensive Coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons when they picked current Lions and former Falcons CB Chris Houston out of Arkansas.

LIONS GO STREAKING

The Detroit Lions were one of only four teams (only NFC) to end the 2010 season on a four-game winning streak.

- With the 20-13 win over Minnesota in the finale, Detroit finished with four-straight wins. The last time the Lions won four consecutive games was October-November 1999 (25-23 vs. Min 10/17/99; 24-9 at Car Oct 10/10/99; 20-3 vs. TB 10/31/99 and 31-27 vs. StL 11/7/99).
- The win over the Vikings marked the first four-game winning streak in December since the team won all four games in December 1995 (27-7 vs. Chi 12/4/95; 24-17 at Hou 12/10/95; 44-0 vs. Jax 12/17/10 and 37-10 at TB 12/23/95).
- Years ending 4-game winning streak: 1944 (5), 1953 (6), 1960 (4), 1970 (5), 1989 (5), 1991 (6), 1995 (7) and 2010 (4).

ROAD WORK

- The win over Miami (12/26), combined with the team's 23-20 overtime win at Tampa Bay (12/29) the prior week gave the Lions their first consecutive road wins since they opened the 2004 season with three straight road victories (20-16 at Chi 9/12/04; 17-10 at Atl 10/10/04 and 28-13 at the NYG 10/24/04).
- The road wins in those two weeks are the first road wins in consecutive weeks since October 1993 when the Lions won 16-13 at the Los Angeles Rams (10/24/93) and at Minnesota (10/31/93).
- With a win at Miami, the Lions won back-to-back road games in December for the first time since 1991 (21-17 at Green Bay 12/15/91 and 17-14 in OT at Buffalo 12/22/91).
- The victory at Tampa Bay (12/19) not only ended the club's 26-game skid on the road, but the overtime win was the club's first road overtime win since the Lions defeated the New York Giants 28-25 October 30, 1994 in sudden death.



Fairley, who the Lions selected in the first round as the 13th overall selection, is expected to be ready to go by the regular season and Schwartz is positive in regards to his rehabilitation and continued involvement.

Schwartz: "He's in all his meetings. He's doing all of that stuff. We don't want to worry about anything other than that."

Young was able to participate in practice on a limited basis in one-one drills on Mon., a positive mark on his improvement.

Schwartz: "He didn't compete against the other players where he'd have to adjust and things like that. We'll take it slow with him and get him a little bit more each time. It shouldn't be a long-term thing; he should be coming back. But we don't usually put a guy back and all of a sudden (have him) come back full speed.

"He's done a very, very good job of staying involved and staying active with other things that he can do. When he's out there, he just needs to take advantage of it. How far behind he is really is yet to be seen. If he's able to be back on the field and able to make plays when he is, he won't be behind at all."

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

In many ways, the 2010 Detroit Lions were perhaps the most-improved team in the entire NFL.

- In 2010, the Lions were one of only 7 teams in the League to increase their win totals by at least four games.
- Improvements are found across the board in each of the team's offense, defense and special teams units. Detroit joined the New York Giants, San Diego Chargers and Tampa Bay Buccaneers as the only teams in the NFL to improve in all six key offensive and defensive League rankings (total, rushing and passing) compared to 2009.

OFFENSIVE CHARGE

On offense, the Lions improved in many areas as it increased production from the 2009 season. In total offense, the Lions were one of just seven teams to improve at least nine positions from 2009, as they went from 26 in 2009 to 17 last year in total offense. In passing, they were one of just three teams to improve their ranking by 9 spots (21 in 2009 to 12 in 2010).

- Detroit had the third-most improved scoring offense in the NFL this season, when compared to 2009. **The Lions scored 100 more points than they did last season, which accounts for an average of 6.3 more points per game.**
- In 2010, the Lions had the fourth-most improved offense in the NFL. **When compared to last year's totals, the Lions gained 639 more yards than they did in 2009 (39.9 more yards per game).**
- **Detroit's pass offense accounted for 642 more yards in 2010 than it did in 2009, which was a total of 40.1 more yards per game and made the Lions' pass offense fifth-most improved unit in the League.**
- The Lions were also the eighth-most improved offense converting on 3rd down. The Lions' offense was confronted with eight more 3rd downs this season, but converted 13 more than it did in 2009, which is a 4.2 percent increase.

NOT AS GIVING

- Detroit's offense was the NFL's most improved unit in giveaways. **The offense gave the ball away 16 less times in 2010 (25) than it did in 2009 (41).** In 2010, the Lions giveaways occurred off 16 interceptions and nine lost fumbles.
- With 16 less interceptions this year than last year (16 in 2010 and 32 in 2009), the Lions were the second-most improved club when it came to throwing picks. They were one of only two clubs (Tampa Bay) to throw at least 10 less interceptions when compared to the year before.

PROTECTING THE QUARTERBACK

The Lions offensive line has been one of the top pass protecting lines in the NFL. Detroit had the third most pass attempts in the League (633) and only allowed 27 sacks in 2010.

- The Lions pass protection has been consistent despite the team starting three different quarterbacks. **Among the teams in the Top-5 in sacks per pass play, only the Lions have started more than one quarterback this season.**
- For the season, the Lions finished with a sacks per pass play percentage of 4.09. It is the third-lowest sacks per pass play percentage allowed by the Lions since 1960.



GETTING DEFENSIVE

The 2010 edition of the Detroit Lions had one of the most improved defenses in the NFL, especially along the defensive line. The Lions' defensive unit improved in several vital statistical categories.

- Detroit was one of six teams to improve their overall total defense ranking by 11 spots (32 in 2009 to 21 in 2010), and they were one just three teams to improve their pass defense by 16 (32 in 2009 to 16 in 2010).
- In the passing game, the defense was the most-improved unit in the NFL. **When compared to 2009, the Lions allowed 751 less yards a game, which equals 46.9 yards per game.**
- Detroit was also the most-improved defensive unit in the League in points allowed when compared to 2009. **The Lions allowed 125 points less than they did last season, which is 7.8 less points per game.**
- The Lions defense was the League's fourth-most improved unit in regards to total yards allowed compared to 2009. **The Lions gave up 777 yards less than they did in 2009, which equates to 48.6 less yards per game.**
- In the team's 44-6 win over St. Louis (10/10), the Lions did not allow a touchdown. The last time the Lions did not allow the opponent to score a touchdown was vs. Seattle Sept. 10, 2006 when they allowed just three field goals against the Seahawks. The Lions lost on a late field goal 9-6.
- The team's defensive effort vs. the Rams marked the first time the Lions allowed six points or less since they defeated Green Bay 17-3 Sept. 11, 2005.
- In Week 13, the defense was instrumental in the team's 7-3 win over the Green Bay Packers, and they held the Packers to 0 points in the first half. They allowed a season-low 258 total yards and a season-low 66 rushing yards.
- **In four home victories in 2010, the defense allowed just two touchdowns, which occurred against Washington (10/31). The defense did not allow a touchdown vs. St. Louis (10/10), Green Bay (12/12) and Minnesota (1/2/11).**

TAKEAWAY TALLIES

- Detroit's defense forced six more turnovers this season than they did last year, which makes that unit the eighth-most improved unit in the NFL in 2010. This past season the Lions registered 29 takeaways (14 interceptions, 15 fumble recoveries).

SPECIAL RETURN

Improvement was not only prevalent with the Lions offensive and defensive units in 2010, but their special teams also improved in some key areas. The return game that was fueled by Pro Bowl alternate WR **Stefan Logan**, who had one of the finer seasons in club history as a kick returner, and the cover teams took a giant step forward led by Pro Bowl alternate S **John Wendling** (special teamer).

- The Lions' kick return unit was the third-most improved unit in the League in kickoff return average. The Lions averaged 3.5 more yards per return than they did in 2009.
- The Lions' had the NFL's 10th-most significant improvement in punt return average in 2010 compared to last season. In 2009, the Lions had an 8.8 punt return average. This year, the Lions improved to average 12.1 yards per return.
- In average kickoff return yardage allowed, Detroit had the fourth-most improved coverage unit. The Lions allowed an average of 2.7 less yards per each kick return.

FRONTAL FORCE

One specific area of great improvement was up front for the Lions on defense that included a revamped defensive line built with superb starters and tremendous depth. This upgrade was definitely noticed when it came to rushing the passer.

- The Lions had the most-improved pass rush in the NFL. **Even though teams threw the ball 9 times less against the Lions this season than they did in 2009, the Lions picked up 18 more sacks, which accounts for an increase of 3.28 sacks**

- Of the Lions 44 sacks, 39 were attributed to the defensive line, 23.5 more than the Lions defensive line accounted for last season.
- The Detroit defensive line was also the most-improved unit in the League in regards to sack yardage, when compared to 2009. **The Lions defensive line was responsible for 179 more yards of sack yardage than last year.**

IN THE REDZONE

The Detroit Lions offense was second in the League in Red Zone efficiency. In 45 trips, the Lions converted 29 TDs.

- QB **Matthew Stafford** engineered touchdowns on 9 of 10 trips in the redzone (other possession resulted in a FG).

IMPROVEMENT

- The Detroit offense was the third-most improved unit in Red Zone touchdowns compared to 2009. **The Lions had 12 more Red Zone touchdowns in 2010 than they did last year.** That equates to a 17.2 percent difference, which makes the Lions' offense the second-most improved unit in Red Zone touchdown percentage as well.
- **The Lions scored 82 more points in the Red Zone than they did in 2009**, which tallied the third-highest improvement.
- They had the fifth-highest increase of Red Zone possessions in the League. **The Lions had 45 red zone possessions in 2010 compared to 36 in 2009.**

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

When it comes to ball security, the Lions were much better in 2010 than in 2009, giving up the ball less and taking away more. Those factored in making the Lions perhaps the most-improved team in the turnover department in 2010. Detroit registered 29 takeaways and 25 giveaways for a +4 turnover margin.

- The Lions were the most improved team in the NFL in turnover margin when compared to the 2009 season. **The Lions had a difference of +22 in turnover margin when comparing the past two seasons.** In 2010, Detroit was +4 and in 2009, it was -18.

THREE-QB PRODUCTION

Despite injuries at the Lions quarterback spot in 2010, all three of the team's signal callers were able to maintain production throughout the season and all three have led the Lions to victory. In all, the Lions started QB **Matthew Stafford** (3 games), QB **Shaun Hill** (10 Games) and QB **Drew Stanton** (3 games), and the team ranked third in the NFL in completions (383), third in attempts (633), 12th in gross passing yards (4,001) and were tied for 11th in touchdown passes (26).

- For the first time in team history, three quarterbacks have each registered 20-or-more attempts and a passer rating of 90.0 each in two games during the same season.
- As a group, each quarterback has attempted 90 passes and the team has a combined passer rating of 82.0. The last team to have three quarterbacks each attempt 90 passes in a season and finish with an 80.0 passer rating was the Miami Dolphins in 1993 (Dan Marino, Steve DeBerg and Scott Mitchell).
- The quarterback unit has also produced 26 touchdown passes and 16 interceptions for a +10 difference. The last team to finished the season having three quarterbacks start three games and finished with a +10 TD to Int ratio was the Philadelphia Eagles in 1993 (+10, 23 TD to 13 Int; Randall Cunningham, Bobby Brister and Ken O'Brien).
- Of the 15 teams to record +10 TD to Int ratio, only Detroit, Pittsburgh and Dallas have started three different quarterbacks, and the Lions were the only team to start each for at least three games.
