



NEW ORLEANS SAINTS OPEN 2009 PRESEASON IN LOUISIANA SUPERDOME VS. BENGALS

Following two weeks of training camp practices and a spirited scrimmage, as well as countless hours in the meeting and weight rooms, the New Orleans Saints will finally take the Louisiana Superdome field for the first time in 2009 when they host the Cincinnati Bengals on Friday, Aug. 14 at 7 p.m.

This will be the third consecutive year the Saints and the Bengals have met in the preseason and eighth time overall. After losing the first preseason contest between the two teams in 1975, the Saints have won six straight exhibitions against Cincinnati, including a 13-0 shutout at Paul Brown Stadium on August 23, 2008.

Friday's matchup will be the first exhibition between the two clubs played at the Superdome since 1989. It will also be the first time the Saints open their preseason slate in their home stadium since 2005. Under Head Coach **Sean Payton**, the Saints have posted a 6-5 mark in the preseason, including a 2-2 mark in 2008.

Both New Orleans and Cincinnati enter the start of the 2009 campaign with great optimism. The league's top-ranked offense in both scoring and yardage, the Saints shattered franchise-records by scoring 463 points and putting up 6,571 total net yards on the ground and through the air. The Saints also set ten other club records on the season.

QB **Drew Brees** enjoyed one of the most prolific seasons ever by a signal-caller and his finest season as a professional. He shattered his own club marks he had set the previous season with 34 touchdown passes and an NFL leading 5,069 passing yards, the second-highest single season total in league history, lead-

ing or tying for first in six categories. Brees also tied a league single-season record with ten days of 300-yards or more passing.

Brees, voted by the Associated Press as the 2008 NFL Offensive Player of the Year, was named to appear in his second Pro Bowl in three seasons, along with T **Jammal Brown**, who represented an offensive line that surrendered a franchise-low 13 sacks, the third-lowest total in the NFL.

The Saints enjoyed a productive offseason, re-signing key contributors on offense and defense in WR **Devery Henderson**, T **Jon Stinchcomb** and LB **Jonathan Vilma**.

While the top-ranked New Orleans offense returns nearly intact with 10-of-11 starters back from the 2008 season, the defense returns most of its key contributors from last season. It has also been bolstered by offseason addition of defensive coordinator **Gregg Williams** and the signings of productive veterans DT **Rod Coleman**, CB **Jabari Greer**, DE **Anthony Hargrove**, S **Darren Sharper** and DE **Paul Spicer**. The Saints special teams units will also feature intriguing battles at punter, kickoff returner and punt returner.

The Bengals finished last season with a disappointing 4-11-1 record as perennial Pro Bowl QB **Carson Palmer** missed the final 11 games with a right elbow injury. However, Cincinnati rallied from a disappointing 1-11-1 start to win their final three contests and their defensive moved up 15 spots in the NFL rankings from 2007 to 12th. The outlook for 2009 is bright as a healthy Palmer returns behind center to once again take snaps for the Bengals.

- **WORTH NOTING:** Friday's game will be New Orleans' eighth preseason meeting with the Bengals, the third straight year the two clubs have faced off in training camp...The Saints lead the preseason series 6-1, winning the last six. The clubs played last year in Cincinnati, with the Saints capturing a 13-0 shutout. The teams have also played 11 times in the regular season. Cincinnati leads the series 6-5, having won the last three, including a 31-16 meeting at the Superdome on November 16, 2006. SAINTS-BENGALS PREVIEW

SAINTS-CINCINNATI SPECIFICS
SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and the Bengals have met seven times during the preseason with New Orleans holding a 6-1 advantage, having run off six straight wins including a 13-0 shutout at Paul Brown Stadium in a 2008 exhibition. The two clubs have faced off against each other for three consecutive years in the preseason. The will be the first exhibition between the Saints and the Bengals played at the Louisiana Superdome since 1989.

During the regular season, Cincinnati holds a 6-5 advantage over New Orleans after 11 meetings. The Bengals have won the last three contests in the series, including a 31-16 victory at the Superdome on Nov. 19, 2006, when QB **Drew Brees** set the club's single-game passing yardage record when he completed 37-of-52 passes for a career-high 510 yards with two touchdown passes and three interceptions.

Head coach **Sean Payton**, strength and conditioning coach **Dan Dalrymple**, running backs coach **Bret Ingalls** and offensive line coach/running game **Aaron Kromer** have all served on the coaching staff at Miami (Ohio) University. TRAINING CAMP PREVIEW POSITION BY POSITION

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACKS (3) - Returners: Drew Brees, Mark Brunell, Joey Harrington. **WORTH NOTING:** Among the league's elite quarterbacks, Brees enjoyed one of the most prolific seasons in NFL history by a signal-caller in 2008. He threw for 5,069 yards, the second-highest single season total in NFL history, received his second Pro Bowl selection in three seasons and was named the NFL Offensive Player of the Year by the Associated Press and *The Sporting News*. Backup signal callers Brunell and Harrington have a combined 23 years of NFL experience, most of which have been spent as productive starters.

RUNNING BACKS (8) - Returners: RB Mike Bell, RB Reggie Bush, RB Lynell Hamilton, FB Olaniyi Sobomehin, RB Pierre Thomas. **Offseason veteran addition:** FB Heath Evans (UFA-NE). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** RB Herb Donaldson (FA), RB P.J. Hill (FA). **Departures from 2008:** FB Mike Karney, RB Deuce McAllister, RB Aaron Stecker. **WORTH NOTING:** The duo of Bush and Thomas are expected to highlight the tailback position. One of the NFL's most versatile and exciting players as a runner, receiver and punt returner, and a threat to score from any part of the field, the multi-talented Bush had nine touchdowns overall and 1,114 all-purpose yards despite missing six games with knee injuries. Thomas, the club's leading rusher in 2008, aims to build on a season where he had 625 yards in part-time duty and scored a team-leading 12 TDs overall, the fourth-highest single season total in club history. Bell and Hamilton, who occupied roster spots at the end of 2008, provide quality depth behind and will compete for roster spots. Evans, a key offseason acquisition from New England has the versatility to block, play a role in both the running and passing game, as well as contributing on special teams. Sobomehin saw action on offense and special teams for the Saints in 2008. Donaldson and Hill both had accomplished college careers and are expected to make a push for a roster spot.

WIDE RECEIVERS (11) - Returners: Adrian Arrington, Marques Colston, Skyler Green, Devery Henderson, Robert Meachem, Lance Moore, Courtney Roby. **Offseason veteran additions:** Paris Warren (FA), D'Juan Woods (FA). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** Rod Harper (FA), Matt Simon (FA). **Departures from 2008:** David Patten. **WORTH NOTING:** Colston, Henderson and Moore headline the New Orleans receiving corps. Colston enters 2009 having enjoyed one of the most prolific three-year receiving stretches in team history with 215 receptions for 3,000 yards and 24 touchdowns. In 2008, he managed 47 catches for 760 yards and five touchdowns despite missing five contests with a thumb injury. Moore (79 receptions, 928 yards, ten touchdowns) enjoyed a breakout campaign, leading the Saints in receiving. Henderson (32 catches, 793 yards) provides the Saints with a deep threat, leading the NFL in receiving average with 24.8 yards per grab. Meachem, the club's first-round pick in 2007, possesses a combination of size, speed and hands that has him poised for a breakout campaign as he competes for an increased role in the wideout rotation. Green, a third-year LSU product, and Roby, a 2008 midseason acquisition, both possess the explosive abilities to impact the kickoff return game. Arrington, New Orleans' final draft choice in 2008, enjoyed an impressive training camp before suffering a season-ending toe injury. Harper, Simon Warren and Woods will push for roster spots.

TIGHT ENDS (5) - Returners: Billy Miller, Buck Ortega, Jeremy Shockey. **Offseason veteran additions:** Dan Campbell (FA), Darnell Dinkins (UFA-Cle). **Departures from 2008:** Mark Campbell. **WORTH NOTING:** A key 2008 acquisition, Shockey is expected to give the offense a boost with his blocking and pass catching abilities. In 2008 he managed 50 grabs, the fifth-highest reception total for a tight end in team history, despite missing four games with hernia and ankle injuries. The Saints will welcome the additions of Campbell and Dinkins, rugged blockers, who possess the ability to spur the running game. Miller is a sure-handed target who caught 45 passes for 579 yards in 2008, with 11 of the receptions going for 20 yards or more, as part of the career resurgence he has enjoyed since joining the club three years ago. Ortega provides solid depth while contributing on special teams.

OFFENSIVE LINE (14) - Returners: T Jermon Bushrod, T Jammal Brown, G Tim Duckworth, G Jahri Evans, C Jonathan Goodwin, G Jamar Nesbit, G Carl Nicks, T Jon Stinchcomb, T Zach Strief. **Offseason veteran additions:** C Digger Bujnoch (FA), G/T Anthony Davis (FA), C/G Nick Leckey (UFA-StL) **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** T Michael Brown (FA), OL Joe McMahon (FA). **Departures from 2008:** C/G Matt Lehr. **WORTH NOTING:** All five starters return (Brown, Evans, Goodwin, Nicks, Stinchcomb) to a front that successfully blocked for an offensive unit that set numerous club records and led the league in both yards per game and scoring, while only surrendering 13 sacks. Brown, a fifth-year veteran, who was named to his second Pro Bowl in three seasons, will once again anchor the left side of the line. He will be joined by Nicks, a 343-pound mauler who enjoyed a standout rookie campaign. In his first season as starter, Goodwin showed an impressive combination of skills, steadiness and leadership as he opened 13 contests in the middle. Evans, a 2006 fourth round draft pick has enjoyed three straight stellar seasons where he has emerged as one of the NFL's top blockers. Stinchcomb has been a model of consistency on the right side since becoming a starter in 2006. Nesbit is a ten-year veteran with extensive starting experience who possesses the ability to play any position on the line. Bushrod and Strief have shown promise in backup roles. Leckey, an offseason acquisition, provides the flexibility to play either guard or center and possesses extensive starting experience.

DEFENSE

DEFENSIVE LINE (13) - Returners: DT Remi Ayodele, DE Jeff Charleston, DT Kendrick Clancy, DT Sedrick Ellis, DE Charles Grant, DE Bobby McCray, DT DeMario Pressley, DE Josh Savage, DE Will Smith. **Offseason veteran additions:** DT Rod Coleman (FA), DE Paul Spicer (FA). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** DT Earl Heyman (FA), DE Jerme Parnell (FA). **Departures from 2008:** DT Antwan Lake, DT James Reed, DT Montavious Stanley, DT Hollis Thomas, DT Brian Young. **WORTH NOTING:** Grant, McCray and Smith give New Orleans one of the top defensive end combinations in the NFL. Grant has recorded 41.5 sacks in his Saints career and seeks to rebound from a triceps injury that cut short his 2008 season at the midpoint. McCray led the Saints with six sacks in 2008 and is the club's speediest player off the edge. Smith is one of two defensive team captains and has recorded 36.5 takedowns in five seasons, while missing only two contests. He has been particularly adept at creating turnovers throughout his career, forcing 13 fumbles and recovering six

PRESEASON GAME 1: NEW ORLEANS SAINTS VS. CINCINNATI BENGALS

Charleston is a high-energy key reserve who chipped in three sacks in spot duty in 2008. Spicer is a ten-year NFL veteran, who is a productive, hard-working defender against the pass and run. Hargrove is a spring pickup who will add depth, experience and strong pass-rushing abilities. Parnell, who played basketball at Mississippi for four years until joining the football team last season, is attempting to continue a transition to the gridiron. The team has solid depth across the defensive tackle position. Ellis, the team's No. 1 pick in 2008, enjoyed a solid rookie season, recording four sacks to rank second on the club and fourth among all NFL rookies, while holding his own against the run. Clancy possesses the girth to close gaps at the line of scrimmage and make the jobs of those around them easier by occupying a pair of blockers on every play. One of the NFL's most productive defensive tackles for several seasons, Coleman brings a unique pass rushing element to the interior of the defensive line.

LINEBACKERS (10) - Returners: Jo-Lonn Dunbar, Troy Evans, Scott Fujita, Marvin Mitchell, Scott Shanle, Mark Simoneau. Jonathan Vilma. **Offseason veteran additions:** Anthony Waters (FA). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** Stanley Arnoux* (D-4b), Jonathan Casillas (FA). **Departures from 2008:** None. **WORTH NOTING:** The New Orleans linebacker corps were one of the defense's most improved areas in 2008, bolstered by the addition of Vilma. Re-signed to a contract extension in the offseason, this cornerstone to the defense brings a combination of speed, instincts, experience and pursuit to the middle of the defense. In his first season with the Saints, the five-year veteran led the Saints with 151 tackles and three fumble recoveries, as he finished near the top among NFL linebackers with four takeaways. Fujita, who is firmly established as one of the club's top defenders and as a team captain, has been a cog on the defense for the last three seasons and notched his third consecutive 100-tackle season, two interceptions and one forced fumble in 2008. Shanle has provided consistent play from the weakside spot since joining the club in 2006 and becoming a full-time starter for the first time in his career. He enjoyed the finest season of his five-year career in 2008 when he registered a career-high 145 stops. Fully recovered from a back injury that forced him to miss the 2008 campaign, Simoneau, a sure tackler, possesses the versatility and intelligence to play all three positions. Dunbar, the only undrafted rookie to make the team's opening day roster in 2008 finished among club leaders with 16 special teams tackles and started two games at the strongside position. Evans notched a career-high 20 special teams tackles and provides valuable depth on defense. The coaching staff is high on Arnoux, a rugged, powerful defender who started in the middle for three years at Wake Forest in the middle and will move outside in his transition to the NFL. He is currently rehabilitating from a ruptured left Achilles tendon injury suffered at the May rookie minicamp. Mitchell, a seventh-round draft pick in 2007, has established himself as a valuable special teams contributor in his first two NFL seasons. Waters, a third-round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in 2007, will seek to contribute on both defense and special teams.

CORNERBACKS (8) - Returners: Jason David, Randall Gay, Tracy Porter, Leigh Torrence. **Offseason veteran additions:** Jabari Greer (UFA-Buf). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** Danny Gorrer (FA), Malcolm Jenkins (D-1), Reggie Jones (FA). **Departures from 2008:** Aaron Glenn, Michael Lehan, Mike McKenzie. **WORTH NOTING:** The cornerback position is at its deepest since Payton arrived in New

Orleans three years ago as head coach and will feature a fierce competition for playing time and roster spots in training camp. The signing of Greer from Buffalo will bring an impressive combination of size and speed to the position. The addition of Gay, a physical and competitive defender, last season bolstered the defensive backfield as he posted 65 tackles, one sack and a team-leading and career-high 17 passes defended. David displayed a nose for the ball, recording a team-leading and career-high five interceptions. Porter, the club's second-round pick in 2008 captured a starting role in a training camp competition and showed great promise before suffering a fractured wrist which required season-ending surgery in game five. On top of the drafting of Porter, 2009 first round pick Jenkins is expected to further inject youth and playmaking ability to the position. Torrence gives the Saints proven depth and was also one of the club's most dependable special teams players after being claimed off of waivers at midseason.

SAFETIES (6) - Returners: Roman Harper, Chris Reis, Usama Young. **Offseason veteran additions:** Pierson Prioleau (UFA, Jax.), Darren Sharper (UFA, Min.). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** Chip Vaughn (D-4A). **Departures from 2008:** Josh Bullocks, Terrence Holt, Kevin Kaesviharn. **WORTH NOTING:** This is another position group that has been significantly revamped in the offseason with a couple of key additions. The key free agency acquisition is Sharper, who adds experience and playmaking abilities to the farthest region of the defense at free safety. Sharper leads all active NFL players with 54 interceptions and has been selected to four Pro Bowls during his 12-year NFL career. The sure-tackling Harper enjoyed a solid season in 2008, finishing with a career-high 106 stops to lead the secondary, while adding nine passes defended and one forced fumble. His aggressiveness and toughness serve him well at the strong safety position. Prioleau is a ten-year NFL veteran who has notched 371 tackles and has made 130 career stops on special teams. He will be an asset in both the secondary in nickel and dime packages and on special teams. Reis has been a key member of the club's special teams coverage units. Vaughn, one of the club's fourth-round picks is a hard-hitter who will compete for playing time in the secondary while contributing on special teams.

Kyle is a 14-year NFL veteran, who has appeared in 178 career regular-season games and eight postseason contests and is known as one of the NFL's most reliable long snappers. Showing the persistence of playing in NFL Europe, attending training camps with multiple teams and spending time on practice squads for five seasons before appearing in a regular season game, Pakulak finally made his NFL debut with New Orleans at midseason with a 47.7 average. Fifth-round draft pick Morstead will compete for punting duties with Pakulak in training camp. The rookie was one of the top punters in the nation at SMU, downing 58 punts inside the 20-yard line.

SAINTS HEAD COACH SEAN PAYTON

Entering his fourth season with the New Orleans Saints, Sean Payton already ranks among the most successful coaches in franchise history, with accomplishments that include winning NFL Coach of the Year honors, leading the club to the NFC Championship and overseeing an offense that has shattered the majority of the team's all-time records.

Payton has also instilled a winning culture within the organization since his arrival by stressing the principles of responsibility, character and accountability. He has rebuilt the roster and put together a staff of coaches that is deep in teachers of the fundamentals. As the team enters preparations for the 2009 campaign, only seven players remain from the roster Payton inherited when he took over in 2006.

In 2008, the Saints ranked No. 1 in the NFL in total offense for only the second time in franchise history – duplicating the feat originally achieved in 2006, Payton's first season with the team. With Payton serving as play-caller, last season, the Saints set franchise records for points (463), total yards (6,571), net passing yardage (4,977), touchdowns (57) and first downs (354).

Also in 2008, New Orleans defeated playoff participants Atlanta and San Diego – with the victory over the Chargers coming in the NFL International Series at London's Wembley Stadium. The Saints also tied a team record for single-game scoring in a 51-29 win over Green Bay.

In 2007, the Saints endured injuries and a slow start, but put together a four-game winning streak. New Orleans finished the season ranked No. 4 in the NFL in total offense while also holding nine opponents to 17 points or fewer.

Payton scrapped the traditional timetable for rebuilding an NFL club in 2006. In his opening season as a head coach, the Saints jumped out to a 3-0 record—a first in team history for a first-year black and gold coach and equaled the team's win total from the previous year—and clinched the NFC South title before the regular season finale. New Orleans led the NFL in total offense and advanced to play in the NFC Championship for the first time.

When the 2006 season came to a close, Payton was voted the NFL Coach of the Year by the Associated Press, Pro Football Weekly/Pro Football Writers of America, the Sporting News and the Maxwell Club.

Payton was hired as the 14th head coach in Saints history on January 18, 2006 after being a member of the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff since 2003. He enters his 13th NFL season and 21st overall in coaching.

Prior to his final campaign with the Cowboys, Payton was promoted to assistant head coach/passing game coordinator and was responsible for the team's play-calling. For the previous two years, he served as the club's assistant head coach/quarterbacks.

In 2005, the Cowboys tied for second in the NFC with 318 first downs. When Payton arrived Dallas had ranked 31st in passing the previous year, but immediately improved to 17th.

Payton arrived in Dallas after four years with the

New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three as offensive coordinator after spending his first season as quarterbacks coach. Payton solidified his reputation as one of the NFL's top offensive minds in 2000. In his first season as offensive coordinator, the Giants won the NFC title and went on to play in Super Bowl XXXV. They scored 328 points – their highest total since 1990 – finished 13th in the NFL in total offense.

Payton was first assigned play-calling duties in New York prior to a contest vs. the New York Jets on Dec. 5, 1999. The Giants responded by scoring 41 points and gaining 490

yards – season-high totals – and he retained that assignment over the final five games of the season. Officially appointed the offensive coordinator the following season, over the next three years the Giants passing attack continually improved, ranking 13th in the NFL in 2000, tied for eighth in 2001 and sixth in 2002.

In 2002, the Giants also finished sixth overall in total offense, the team's highest ranking since 1985. In the decade before his arrival, they hadn't ranked above 20th. Prior to joining the Giants, he spent 1997 and 1998 as Philadelphia's quarterbacks coach.

During his coaching career, Payton has enjoyed particular success tutoring quarterbacks. Drew Brees has thrived in New Orleans, including last year becoming only the second passer in NFL history to throw for over 5,000 yards in a season. In 2007, Brees set a league record with 440 completions, and now owns club records for almost every single-season category.

Since 2000, every passer under Payton's guidance has thrown for over 3,000 yards. The three starting quarterbacks he worked with in Dallas - Drew Bledsoe in 2005, Vinny Testaverde in 2004 and Quincy Carter in 2003 - all surpassed the milestone. And while in New York, Giants QB Kerry Collins has 4,073 yards in 2002.

Payton wrapped two coaching stints at San Diego State (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). During his second stretch with the Aztecs, he was running backs coach, working with Heisman runner-up **Marshall Faulk** before becoming quarterbacks coach.

Following the 1993 season, Payton moved to Miami of Ohio (1994-95) where he was quarterbacks coach prior to being promoted to co-offensive coordinator for his final season. He spent 1996 as quarterbacks coach at the University of Illinois before entering the NFL.

Payton earned a degree in communications at Eastern Illinois University, where he passed for 10,665 yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time Associated Press All-American selection followed his college career with stints with the Chicago Bruisers of the Arena Football League, the Ottawa Roughriders of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000.

Born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton and his wife, Beth, have a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.
